4. References to outside authority are timely, to the point and help develop the thesis. (Bear in mind that sometimes current sources are unavailable.)
5. Integration of original ideas with documented facts and opinions of others is skillfully demonstrated.
6. The writing is clearly the voice of the writer.
7. Sentences are free from grammatical and spelling errors.
8. Sentences demonstrate variety in both length and pattern. In addition, words and phrases are chosen with economy and precision.
9. A consistency of citation and bibliographic form is rigorously maintained.
10. The annotation is analytical and descriptive as well as brief.

The Research Review Competition Process

Process for Students

Students may submit research papers with a grade of "A" from *all academic disciplines* and from all courses taken during the current academic year. The papers must be accompanied by a completed application form and may be submitted by the individual student or by a faculty member. More than one paper may be submitted.

Students may obtain an *application form* from the Reference Desk, the Library's web site, classroom instructors or email postings from the Library.

Students may submit papers (with completed *application form*) throughout the academic year to the Chairperson of the Panel by the established deadline.

The names of the students who win *First Place, Second Place, Third Place and Honorable Mention* are posted in the Library in July.

At the end of the competition, all students who submitted papers are sent letters by August:

- Students who submitted the *winning papers* receive a *letter of congratulations*, which provides information about awards and the Honors Night held in September.
- All of the students who do not win are sent *letters thanking them for their participation* and listing the names of the winners.
- All of the students who enter the competition receive an *additional letter* with a *Certificate of Participation* by September. This certificate includes a signature from the President of the College, Library Chairperson, Panel Chairperson and Faculty Council Chairperson.
- The winners' classroom instructors are sent a *thank you letter* for encouraging their students to submit papers. They are also invited to attend Honors Night to support their students.

The awards vary each year according to funding received from LaGuardia's Faculty Council and the Library. The 2007 awards will include the following:

- First Place Winner** will receive a *\$100 U. S. Savings Bond* and an *iPod Shuffle*.
- Second Place Winner(s)** will receive a *\$75 U. S. Savings Bond* and a *USB 256 MB Flash Drive*.
- Third Place Winner(s)** will receive a *\$50 U. S. Savings Bond* and a *USB 256 MB Flash Drive*.
- Honorable Mention Winner(s)** will receive a *\$25 Bookstore Certificate*.
- All winners** are invited to attend the **Honors Night Ceremony** and receive an *Outstanding Academic Achievement Certificate* from the college.
- All of the students who enter** the competition will receive a *Certificate of Participation* from the Library.

Process for Panel Members

The Panel's Chairperson implements publicity by:

- posting college-wide e-mails to faculty, staff and students
- distributing program flyers
- writing articles for library and college newsletters
- posting announcements on the Library's web site and providing program flyers at the Reference Desk

The Panel's Chairperson screens all papers submitted to ensure that guidelines are met and distributes copies of eligible papers to each panel member.

During the academic year, the Panel's Chairperson convenes meetings with Panel members from *various academic disciplines* to accomplish tasks in stages:

- First meeting at the beginning of the academic year includes:
 - reviewing guidelines and forms
 - discussing publicity and establishing dates for additional meetings
- Second meeting during the Spring Semester includes:
 - reviewing and distributing papers to Panel members
 - establishing a date to submit ratings to Panel's Chairperson
 - establishing a date to select the winning research papers
- Third meeting after the papers have been reviewed and rated includes:
 - reviewing ratings and selecting winning research papers
 - reviewing competition guidelines for any new modifications

The Chairperson and Panel meet and review compiled ratings, discuss papers, and select the winners.

Responsibilities of Panel Members

The responsibilities of the Panel include:

- reviewing and rating papers on individual forms (over a set period)
- sending ratings to Panel's Chairperson
- compiling ratings into one list is done by the Panel's Chairperson

Rules for Entry

RESEARCH REVIEW COMPETITION

RULES FOR ENTRY

THE RESEARCH REVIEW COMPETITION IS JOINTLY SPONSORED BY THE LIBRARY AND FACULTY COUNCIL. AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE IN WRITING A RESEARCH PAPER WILL BE PRESENTED TO WINNERS AT HONORS NIGHT EACH SEPTEMBER. PAPERS WILL BE JUDGED BY A PANEL OF FACULTY MEMBERS. ALL OF THE DECISIONS OF THE RESEARCH REVIEW PANEL ARE FINAL.

I. RESEARCH PAPER DEFINED

For the purpose of this competition, the research paper is defined as an expository paper on a single subject. The writer must demonstrate skillful integration of original ideas with documented facts and opinions of others.

II. ELIGIBILITY AND NOMINATION PROCEDURES

- Research papers that receive a grade of "A" in a LaGuardia course during the current academic year may be nominated either by the student author or by the instructor who graded the paper.
- NO ENTRY WILL BE CONSIDERED UNLESS IT IS ACCOMPANIED BY THE ATTACHED COVER SHEET AND MEETS ALL OF THE BASIC REQUIREMENTS OUTLINED BELOW.**

III. BASIC REQUIREMENTS OF THE RESEARCH PAPER

- All entries must demonstrate the student's knowledge of essay structure (i.e., introduction, body and conclusion), correct grammar, spelling and punctuation, as well as a mature vocabulary and style.
- All entries must include correct footnotes, endnotes or internal documentation. A minimum of three sources in the bibliography must be annotated. If the original paper does not include an annotated bibliography, it must be added for the competition. The annotations should demonstrate the student's ability to locate and critically evaluate a variety of information sources.

Annual Library Research Review Competition

For the past 23 years, the library has sponsored a Research Review Competition. Over 300 students have submitted research papers, with more than 60 winners. During 1994-95, Faculty Council began to co-sponsor the competition, providing U.S. Savings Bonds for all the winners.

Here's how the competition works: Students and faculty are invited to enter research papers via collegewide announcements. Reference librarians can provide additional information. Research papers may be submitted throughout the academic year, with an annual deadline in July. A faculty panel from various disciplines reviews, evaluates and selects winning papers. This year's deadline will be July 12.

Students who receive an "A" grade on a research paper for a course taken at LaGuardia during the current academic year are eligible to enter. The winning essay must demonstrate the ability to conduct a literature search, incorporate relevant sources, and effectively express the main idea or thesis. The research paper also must be accompanied by a "Works Cited" or "References" list, with at least three annotated sources.

All students who enter the competition receive a Certificate of Participation, which includes the president's signature. Competition winners receive an Outstanding Academic Certificate, as well as the following:

- First Place - \$100 U.S. Savings Bond
- Second Place - \$75 U.S. Savings Bond
- Third Place - \$50 U.S. Savings Bond

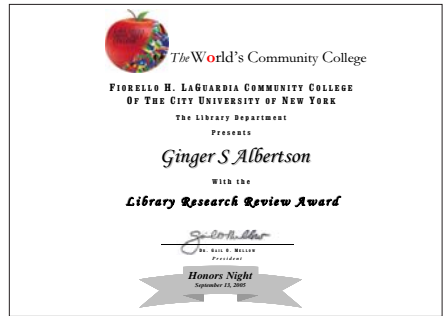

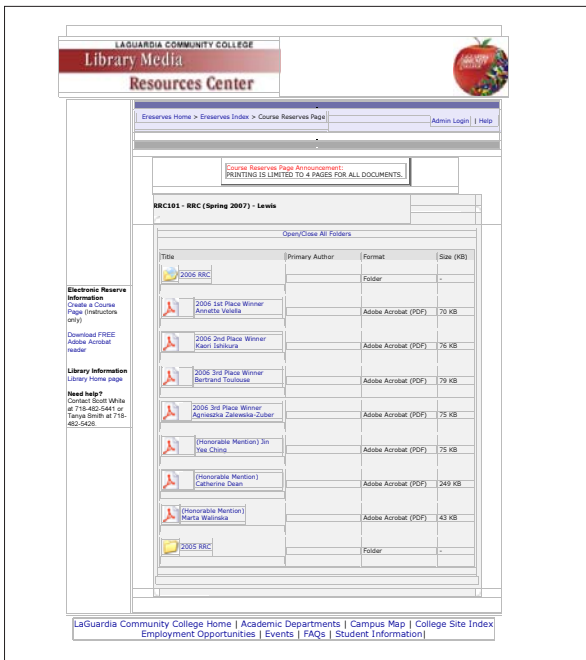
