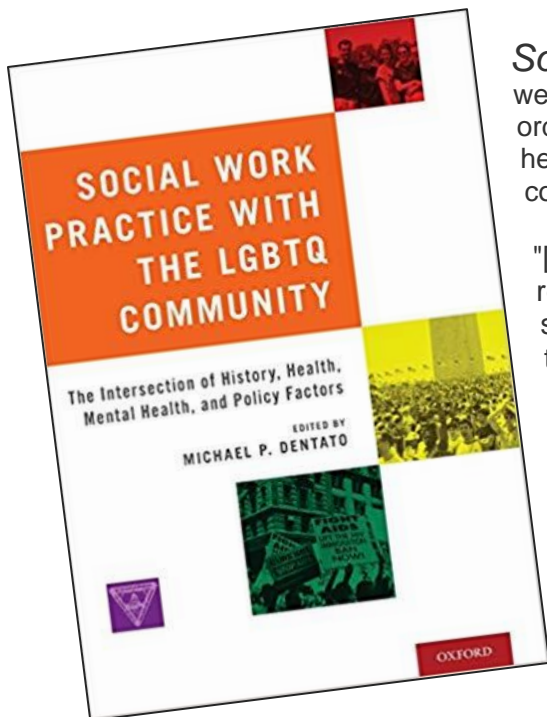


# Book(s) of the Week

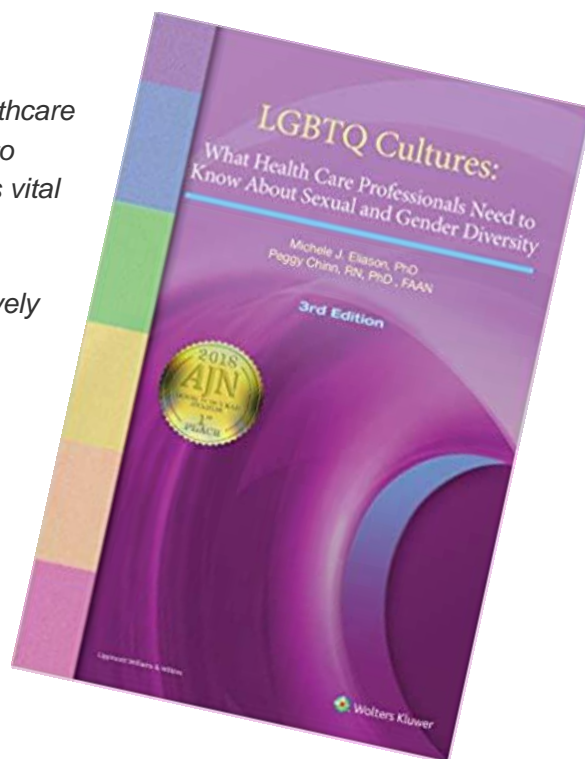
