

Citation Examples for “Works Cited” List

At the end of your paper, you must provide an alphabetical listing of all the works you have cited in your paper. This requirement includes both work you have actually quoted and work you have summarized or paraphrased. The information is arranged alphabetically according to the author’s last name or, when there is no author identified, by title.

Periodical Articles, Printed and Online

Basic Elements:

Print periodical article:

Author’s Last name, Author’s First name. “Title of the Article.” *Title of the Periodical* [the “container” of the article], vol. [number], [issue] no., Publication Date, p. [page number] or pp. [page numbers].

Online periodical article:

Author’s Last name, Author’s First name. “Title of the Article.” *Title of the Periodical* [the “container” of the article], vol. [number], [issue] no., Publication date, p. [page number] or pp. [page numbers]. *Title of website or database* [“container” of the first “container”], DOI or URL.

Article in a scholarly journal

Note: Always add descriptive note after book review title, as follows: Review of [Book Title], by [author’s First name Last name].

Article on a website (with no publication date - *MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.111)

Note: Date of access is usually optional but should be provided if there is no publication date.
