

Citation Examples for “Works Cited” List

At the end of your paper, you must provide an alphabetical listing of all the works you have cited in your paper. This requirement includes both work you have actually quoted and work you have summarized or paraphrased. The information is arranged alphabetically according to the author’s last name or, when there is no author identified, by title.

Print Books

Basic Elements:

Author’s Last name, Author’s first name. *Full title*. Publisher, Date. Series [optional].

E-book: Take the full title from the title page of the book.

- Authors, editors, and series usually appear on the title page.
- Publisher and date of publication are found on the front or back of the title page.

Book by two authors (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.7)

Book by three or more authors (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.8)

Quirk, Randolph, et al. *A Comprehensive Grammar of the English Language*. Longman, 1985.

Book by a corporate author (an organization, group or governmental body)

(*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.17-5.22)

American Medical Association. *Essential Guide to Asthma*. Pocket Books, 1998.

United States, Department of Labor. *Child Care: A Workforce Issue*. Government Printing Office, 1988.

Note: If the corporate author is the same as the book publisher, omit the author:

Reading at Risk: A Survey of Literary Reading in America. National Endowment for the Arts, June 2004.

Book by an editor (ed.) or compiler (comp.) (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.3)

Allison, Nancy, editor. *The Illustrated Encyclopedia of Body-Mind Disciplines*. Rosen, 1999.

Duminy, James, et al., editors. *Planning and the Case Study Method in Africa: The Planner in Dirty Shoes*. Palgrave Macmillan, 2014.

Note: This book has three or more editors.

Spafford, Peter R., and Millicent Monroe, compilers. *The Protocol of Heaven*. Ballantine, 2002.

Book by author and editor (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.38-39)

Shakespeare, William. *Hamlet*. Edited by Harold Jenkins, Methuen, 1982.

Book by writer using a pseudonym (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.14)

Bachman, Richard [Stephen King]. *The Long Walk*. Signet, 1979.

or

King, Stephen. [*published as* Richard Bachman]. *The Long Walk*. Signet, 1979.

Twain, Mark. *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*. William Collins, 2010.

Book with no author given (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.3)

Collins Quotation Finder. Rev. ed., HarperCollins, 2001.

Two or more books by the same author (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.125-129)

Tan, Amy. *The Joy Luck Club*. Putnam's, 1989.

---. *The Kitchen God's Wife*. Putnam's, 1991.

Note: For multiple works by multiple authors and other contributors, see MLA9, sect. 5.126-129.

Translation (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.39)

Flaubert, Gustave. *Madam Bovary*. Translated by Geoffrey Wall, rev. ed., Penguin Books, 2007.

Edition (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.39)

SarDesai, D. R. *Vietnam: Past and Present*. 3rd ed., Westview Publishers, 1998.

Book in a series (*MLA Handbook*, 9th ed., sect. 5.115)

Heisler, Martin O., and Barbara S. Heisler. *From Foreign Workers to Settlers? Transnational Migration and the Emergence of New Minorities*. Sage, 1986. *Annals of the American Academy of Political and Social Science* 485.

Note: Series is an optional addition to the citation.
