

Citation Examples for “Works Cited” List

At the end of your paper, you must provide an alphabetical listing of all the works you have cited in your paper. This requirement includes both work you have actually quoted and work you have summarized or paraphrased. The information is arranged alphabetically according to the author’s last name or, when there is no author identified, by title.

Websites and Web pages

Basic Elements:

Websites

Author’s Last name, Author’s First name. *Title of the website*. Publisher of the website, Publication Date, DOI or URL.

Web pages or Documents on a website

Author’s Last name, Author’s First name. “Title of the page or document.” *Title of the website*, Publication Date, DOI or URL.

Complete website

Eaves, Morris, et al., editors. *The William Blake Archive*. Library of Congress, 1996-2017, blakearchive.org/blake. Accessed 23 July 2018.

Note: Date of Access is optional, but should be included if no publication date is available.

Note: When the corporate author is the same as the book publisher, omit the author.
